

#### Carbohydrate Stain Photomicrographs



### 2: Movat's Pentachrome (Russell modification), Colon @ 20x

The long crypts of the mucosa are lined by secretory goblet cells containing blue-green stained mucins.

- Mucins = blue-green
- Nuclei = dark red
- Muscle & cytoplasm = red
- Collagen = pale orange orange
- Elastic fibers = black/ dark red



### 1: Periodic Acid Schiff with Fast Green counterstain, Kidney @ 40x

A glomerulus within Bowman's capsule is seen at the center surrounded by associated renal tubules. The basement membranes within kidney are an excellent control for the PAS stain.

- Basement membrane = pink
- Mucins = pink
- RBCs and cytoplasm = green-blue



#### 3: Alcian Blue pH 2.5, Rat knee @ 10x

This is a sagittal section of a rat knee showing the hyaline cartilage-rich epiphyseal line of the distal femur.

- Acidic mucosubstances dark blue
- Hyaluronic acid = dark blue
- Nuclei, RBCs = rose
- Background = light pink
