#### Academic Programs for Histotechnology in North Carolina

Many of my fellow histotechs have found themselves in the histology lab having entered from a related life science or medical field – making our origin stories are so interesting - but did you know that NC is now home to three Histotechnology academic programs?

#### Carolinas College of Health Sciences, Charlotte, NC

CCHS graduates complete a 31-week NAACLS accredited program which prepares them to successfully pass the ASCP BOC Exam and function as competent entry-level histotechnologists. This program is in its 5<sup>th</sup> year and led by Education Coordinator Tracy Walling (<u>tracy.walling@carolinashealthcare.org</u>). Students have scored well above the national average on the registry exam, completed the program with a 100% graduation rate, and most receive multiple employment offers upon completion. The CCHS program offers integration of didactic lecture, fully-equipped laboratory training, and supervised experience in support of the clinic at Carolinas Healthcare System. #### <u>Alamance Community College, Graham, NC</u>

Alamance Community College (ACC) recently launched a 2-year Histotechnology degree program. It will be part of the school's new Biotechnology Center of Excellence. The program will be headed by Dr. Bridget Ledford Waters, the current department head of the NAACLS accredited Medical Laboratory Technology (MLT) program at ACC. Students completing the Histotechnology program at ACC will pass through didactic lecture, laboratory training (in partnership with LabCorp) and clinical practicum at area hospitals, clinics and/or reference laboratories.
